


#### **Dennis Carl Wortman** Dennis Carl Wortman, age 74, of Gould City, MI,

## **Social Security Benefits Increase in 2021**

Nearly 70 million Americans will see a 1.3 percent increase in their Social Security benefits and SSI payments in 2021. Federal benefit rates increase when the cost-of-living rises, as measured by the Department of Labor's Consumer Price Index

The CPI-W rises when inflation increases, leading to a higher cost-of-living. This change means prices for goods and services, on average, are a little more expensive, so the COLA helps to offset these costs.

January 2021 marks other changes that will happen based on the increase in the national average wage index. For example, the maximum amount of earnings subject to Social Security payroll tax in 2021 will be higher. The retirement earnings test exempt amount will also change in 2021. You can read our press release for more information at www.ssa.gov/news/press/factsheets/colafacts2021.pdf.

We will mail COLA notices throughout the month of December to retirement, survivors, and disability beneficiaries. SSI recipients, and representative payees. Want to know your new benefit amount sooner? You can securely view and save the Social Security COLA notice online via the Message Center inside my Social Security in early December without waiting for the mailed notice.

If you don't have an account yet, you will have to create your account by November 18, 2020 to receive the COLA notice online this year. my Social Security account holders can opt out of receiving a mailed COLA notice and other paper notices that are available online. You can choose text or email alerts when there is a notice in Message Center by updating your Preferences at www.ssa.gov/myaccount/opt-out.html so you always know when we have something important for you.

#### The Late Season

The 2020 Michigan Regular Firearms Deer Season was less than productive for the Weekly Sportsman. Due to weather, work schedule, family time, and other responsibilities not much time was spent afield. When was the last time hunters experienced a thunder and lightning storm opening morning? High winds and falling trees became commonplace over the two weeks which caused deer to just stay bedded down and wait for their overloaded and super sensitive auditory systems to recover and adjust.

There was one night when the snow started around 4:00 p.m. and it made the evening hunt almost magical or mystical as deer seemed to appear everywhere and from out of almost nowhere. The Weekly Sportsman sat in an Ameristep Outhouse blind while many bucks and does meandered around and were oblivious that the year round placed blind was occupied. For once, the Weekly Sportsman never lifted the .44 magnum rifle and just watched the show play out as twilight quickly approached. Then it happened... a very, very large bodied buck was running full tilt toward the blind on a deer run that could eventually put him merely a few feet away. Large dark stained antlers were visible as this was probably the second largest buck ever witnessed by the Weekly Sportsman on the family farm. In a smooth almost natural movement, much like a scene from The Last of the Mohicans, the rifle was raised and the hammer cocked simultaneously. Unfortunately the agitated buck heard the cocking of the hammer and put the brakes on hard and bolted sideways. It all happened so quickly. The buck stopped at about 175 yards and looked over his shoulder back down the hill toward the blind and then slowly walked over the ridge. Clearly this wasn't his first rodeo.

Alas, the "Late Season" is upon us in December as Muzzleloader Season runs from December 4th-13th. Redemption is possible for the Weekly Sportsman and many others and according to the DNR you can use a shotgun or straight walled pistol cartridge rifle during this period. If you still haven't filled a buck tag, combo license, or doe tag then plan to hunt the late doe season from December 14th through January 1st. Your unused buck tags can be used on does. Deer behavior changes in December and while there sometimes is a faint second rut most deer are now focused on locating food sources and not reproductive practices. As the days grow shorter and usually colder, along with the increased chance of snow, deer start to be out and about more in the midday period. Sleep in and bring a sack lunch to any stand that overlooks an unharvested cornfield along with green fields of alfalfa, wheat, or rye. If you happened to plant a brassica food plot now is when the plants begin to sweeten. Deer are moving around to stay warm and trying to fuel their internal furnaces and build last minute reserves.

Also, there is no excuse for not having a valid tag with you as the DNR reports their vendor's licensing system is back up and running after experiencing some computer quirks opening weekend.


