This funding was made available through the United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Meat and Poultry Inspection Readiness Grant (MPIRG) program.

'Today's investments in Michigan's small agriculture businesses will strengthen our food supply

chain and help reduce food costs while creating good-paying jobs for Michiganders," said Governor Whitmer. "Michigan is known for its strong food and agriculture businesses, and I'm thrilled that USDA is committed to helping them continue to thrive in our state. I will work with anyone to invest in every region of our great state and was proud to invest in rural and agriculture economic development in the bipartisan budget I signed a two months ago, empowering rural Michigan to compete for and win more projects and create good-paying jobs

MPIRG, a new program authorized by the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021, is jointly administered by USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service and Food Safety and Inspection Service. 

## **Shiawassee County Bat Tested Positive for Rabies**

submitted by Grace Czubachowkski On August 30, 2022, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) laboratory confirmed that a bat found in Shiawassee County tested positive for rabies. Rabies can only be confirmed with laboratory testing. While this bat was found in the City of Owosso, it is important for county residents continue to use caution with bats no matter their location.

Rabies is most commonly transmitted by a rabid animal scratch or bite. Most reported cases occur in wild animals such as raccoons, skunks, bats, and foxes.

If a bat is found inside the home, the Shiawassee County Health Department recommends safely collecting the bat and following these guidelines:

•Wear leather gloves. A bat should never be handled with bare hands.

•Place a clear container over the bat, slide a piece of sturdy cardboard under the container, and firmly secure the cardboard or the lid to the container with tape.

•Contact the Communicable Disease Nurse at the Shiawassee County Health Department at 989-743-2356. If the Health Department is closed, keep the bat cold until it can be taken to the Health Department.

•A dead bat should be submitted to the Health Department for rabies testing. Do not crush the bat or put the bat into the

Most people know when they have been bitten. However, exposure can occur without an individual knowing they have been scratched or bitten, especially with bats. Bats have small teeth and tiny claws, making it difficult for an exposure to be

A sleeping person awakened to a bat in the room is considered exposed. It is also considered an exposure when a bat is found in a room with an unattended child, or a mentally impaired or intoxicated person. Under such circumstances, it is very important to capture the bat for testing.

If a pet has been exposed, it is important to capture the bat and submit it for testing. If this cannot be done, follow up with your veterinarian or Disease Surveillance at 989-743-2356. All cats and dogs must have current rabies vaccinations.

Death from the disease is most frequently a result of individuals being unaware of their exposure, or from failure to seek medical attention after being bitten or scratched. On average 2-3 people in the United Stated die each year due to rabies.






#### **Jeanne Louise Serviss**

riage, prior to Peter's passing on January 9, 2011.



But the Laingsburg Wolfpack served notice on Thursday evening here.

The Pirates may not be enjoying their typical romp through CMAC foes in 2022. They certainly had their confidence shaken by a ferocious Wolfpack comeback that ended up just short, in a 28-21 loss to the host Pirates.

P-W, coming off an opening 26-6 loss to Redford Union, evened its record at 1-1, 1-0 in CMAC play. Coach Brian Borgman's Wolves are now 0-2, 0-1, including an opening night 50-31 loss to non-league Durand.

"Laingsburg is a good football team and we needed to play a clean football game, eliminating mistakes. That being said, if we execute and don't turn the ball over, we can play with a team like that," said P-W coach Jeremy Miller, whose school owns a 45-15-2 all-time advantage over LHS.







## **Marauders Trouce Byron on MMAC Gridiron** for 1st Win of 2022

BYRON-Logan Thompson rushed for 62 yards and two touchdowns, Tryce Tokar 50 yards and a pair of scores, and Jamison Custer led a dominant Ovid-Elsie ground attack with 93 yards as O-E crushed Byron on Thursday night on the road.

How good was Marauder the scheme? Custer averaged 31 yards per carry, and five other players averaged dou-

ble-digit yardage per run.
O-E's 55-7 win also featured touchdown runs by Custer, Isaac Orta, Perrien Rasch and Caven Brooks as coach Travis Long's crew mauled the Eagle defense to the tune of 572 yards - on just 46 plays. 495 of those yards came on the ground.

The Marauders — still stinging from an opening game loss at Portland — dominated their first league game in defense of their 2021 Mid-Michigan Activities Association (MMAC) championship, taking command with three TDs in the first quarter.

The Eagles, coming off a 1-8 season and playing their first game under new head coach Matt Wilcox, kept things close, relatively, in the first quarter. Byron trailed 21-7 at the quarter break after QB Nathan Erdman found Reece Arndt on a scoring toss. Arndt finished as the host's offensive leader with four catches for 83 yards; Erdman completed 4-of-9 aerials for 105 yards.

But that was the only yardage a bruising O-E defense would allow. BHS ran the ball 23 times — for negative 18 yards. Clay Wittenberg (8 tackles), Gage Kvalevog (5) and Cohen Brown (5) anchored against the run, while Braxton Stenger picked off three Eagle aerials and had a tackle for loss. Drake Ritter also snared an interception for O-E.

Tokar clicked on 3-of-4 passes for 50 yards, and Colin Veith was good on 1-of-4 passes for 27 yards. Veith added 23 yards rushing on just two carries.

Ten different ballcarriers punished the Eagle defense, including Carter Kelley (33 yards), Cole Workman (19 yards) and Brown (9 yards).

Wittenberg, Stenger and Logan Thompson all caught passes for O-E, Wittenberg leading the way with two grabs for 38 yards.

Brooks attempted three extra point kicks, and hit all three.

The romp was a good warm-up for Long's charges, as they next take on a powerhouse Durand offense that features an old-school T-formation, ground-and-pound attack. That MMAC showdown is September 9 at Mark O'Donnell Field.
